COLLEGE PROFILE

Baring Union Christian College owes its existence to the vision and devotion shared and nurtured by Rev. Francis Henry Baring and Miss Charlotte Marie Tucker, and many other educational reformers. With mutual support Rev. Baring and Miss Tucker established Baring School in 1934.

To serve and empower the people of the region the school was upgraded to a College in 1944 upto Intermediate classes. In March 1947, despite the communal disturbances, the college started functioning again. After partition, this was the only Christian College in North-West of Delhi. A full graduate program was introduced in 1948 and Post Graduation was introduced in 1966. Baring is one of the oldest colleges in Punjab affiliated first to Punjab University, and later to Guru Nanak Dev University. Interestingly the country mansion of Maharaja Sher Singh (Son of Maharaja Ranjit Singh) was chosen as an ideal setting for learning by Rev. Baring.

The administrative offices are located in the historic summer palace of Maharaja Sher Singh. The sylvan surroundings of the college coupled with an excellent infrastructure provide a conducive ambience for scholarly pursuits.



- vii. A photocopy of **Aadhar Card** of the student.

Admission Procedure, Rules & Guidelines

Step 1: i) Fill the Admission form duly in your own handwriting.

ii) Paste Two (2) Passport - Size Photographs and attach/staple other one (1) with the filled Admission form.

iii) Enclose a photocopy of your Aadhar Card.

- iv) If you are coming from other college, then you must attach Inter-College Migration Certificate issued by the University.
- v) Get the filled Admission Form Signed / Thumb Impressioned by Parents / Guardian.
- Step 2 : Get the filled Admission Form verified from Eligibility Committee.
- Get the filled Admission Form signed by Admission Step 3: Committee.

Get the signature of the Principal. Step 4 : Step 5 : Deposit the fee in the Accounts Office.

- * Students are advised to contact Guidance Committee for any help regarding admission.
- * The Principal reserves the right to grant / refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
- * The Fee once deposited will not be refunded.
- Students admitted provisionally to any semester / course will be given regular admission only after providing the relevant certificate as proof (as per the requirements of GNDU / Punjab Government).

Attendance Requirement For University Examination

A student must attend at least 75% of the full course of lectures delivered to the theory classes in each subject and 75% of the periods assigned to practical work in the concerned subject. In a special case, the Principal shall have the authority to condone the shortage as per chapter 15 (II) 1.1 of GNDU Calender / 2008. volume-II.

Discipline Matters

- Each student is issued an **Identity Card** which he / she must always carry and shall produce whenever asked by the college authorities. No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the Identity Card. A student must write his/her time table on I Card.
- The names of the students remaining absent consecutively for six lectures or twelve days in a month will be struck off from the college rolls. They can be re-admitted as per the college
- Use of Mobile Phones is strictly prohibited for students in
- the classrooms, labs, library, corridors of Academic blocks. The defaulter will be fined Rs.1500/- and the mobile phone will be confiscated.
- Smoking and drinking is strictly prohibited at College Campus, Hostel, Canteen etc. Any student caught violating rules will be severely panalized & punished.
- Students are not to invite / bring non-scholars to the college. Any student found guilty will face strict disciplinary action.
- Students are expected to focus more on academic and coacademic activities.

UNIVERSITY RULES FOR PROMOTION OF STUDENTS **UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM***

FOR SIX - SEMESTER COURSES

BA, B Com (Regular), B Sc (Medical / Non-Medical / Computer Science / IT / Economics), BCA

- a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st Semester to 2nd Semester.
- b. A student shall be promoted to the 3rd Semester only if he / she has passed at least 50% courses / papers of the first two semesters.
- c. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 3rd Semester to 4th Semester.
- d. A student shall be promoted to 5th Semester only If he / she has passed at least 50% courses / papers of the
- e. A student shall be promoted to 6th Semester only if he / she has passed all the papers of the first semester. After the period of six semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

FOR FOUR - SEMESTER COURSES

- a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st Semester to 2nd Semester.
- b. A student shall be promoted to the 3rd Semester only if he/she has passed at least 50% courses/papers of the first two semesters.
- c. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 3rd Semester to 4th Semester.
- d. In case a student fails to pass all the courses / papers within a period of four semesters (two years), he / she shall be given four consecutive semesters (two years) more to pass.

FOR TWO - SEMESTER COURSES

PGDCA (Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications), DCA (Diploma in Computer Applications), DWD (Diploma in Web Designing)

- a. There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st semester to 2nd semester.
- b. In case a student fails to pass all the courses / papers within period of two semesters (one year), he / she will be given two consecutive semesters (one year) more to pass.

Ragging - free Campus Ragging is a Crime

RAGGING UNDERTAKING: As per the directions of Hon. Supreme court & UGC/MHRD regulations, it is mandatory for every student to fill an on line form of "Anti Ragging Undertaking" which is available at www.amanmovement.org (OR) www.antiragging.in Further, you are instructed to deposit the printout after filling up the online undertaking form to the College Library to get your identity card, within 3 to 5 days after your admission.



UGC vide letter no. F-1-15 / 2009 / (ACR) dated 25.02.2016 has reinforced / recognized a system of prohibition, prevention and punishment to put an END TO MENACE OF RAGGING.

WHAT IS RAGGING? According to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, ragging includes "disorderly behavior or treatment with fellow student whether by words, spoken or written or by an act which has effect of teasing, treating and handling with rudeness with any other student, indulging in rowdy or indecent activities, which may cause or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student."

Some of the PUNISHMENTS for students involved directly or indirectly in Ragging and its abetment are as follows :

- Cancellation of Admission
 Suspension from classes
- Expulsion from the college
- Fine upto Rs. 25000/-

- · Lodging of FIR / Police action against on offender
- Rigorous imprisonment upto 3 years (under the Court of Law)



College Chapel

In the midst of our modern buildings, the college chapel, built in 1897, still remains the most beautiful structure. There is abundance of artistic details throughout its structure. Most part of its design is of Rev. Henry Baring and it offers a striking blend of Sikh, Muslim and European



architecture. The items of particular interest are the stained glass windows, the wood carving and the mosaic floor in the chapel. The large double door at the entrance is beautifully carved with Biblical symbols, parables and verses. The college begins its day's work with worship in the chapel. Both the staff and the students lead the service voluntarily. Chapel Prayer Hall remains open during college hours. Students & staff of all faiths are welcome to offer their prayers.

Along with providing guidance to their intellect, Baring college has always sought to nurture the spiritual faculties of students, the Counseling Centre on the college premises fulfills the psycho-spiritual needs of students. The Rev. Sohan Lal, has been actively engaged in organizing various activities like seminars, meetings and counseling sessions etc. with students to provide a value orientation to their lives.



Supportive Services & Spaces

Library

The computerised Wi-Fi college library has earned a reputation for its vast collection of books. The three-storey library building has a seating capacity for 400 students at a time and it can stock more than one lakh books. The building provides all amenities for serious reading including fully air-conditioned library hall. At present, the library has more than 82,000 books on various branches of knowledge; it receives more than 80 journals / magazines / periodicals and daily newspapers. Besides this it has a good collection of maps and other non-book reading material. The library collection is well classified, catalogued and kept on OPEN SHELVES in a systematic way. The students have full freedom to take any book of their choice from the shelves, read and get it issued for home use. The library has • General Reading Hall • Newspaper and Magazine Section • Reference Section • Reading Room for Teachers •



Science and Commerce Section • MA English Reading Hall • MA Punjabi Section • MA Hindi Section • MSc IT & Computer Science section.

MA English Reading Hall bas about 10,500 books on literature & criticism. The library is spacious and well furnished with individual carrels for serious study. MA Punjabi section has more that 7000 books on criticism with good number of journals on language and literature. All the post graduate students are required to study for two hours daily in the library and it is part of their attendance. Library collection is updated every year.

Book Bank

To assist the disadvantaged and deserving students the college provides Book Bank facility. This section has more than 18,000 books.



Through this scheme text books are issued to the needy & meritorious students for full academic session.

Research Centre

A special computer lab having 10 computers with internet facility has been setup in the Dr. Ram Singh Library of the college for students and academic research scholars.



College Publications

The college magazine Deepshikha is published once in a year. It is a periodical of students and staff which contains articles, poems and stories of general interest besides the college news. It offers a chance to the students to



manifest their creative and critical potential. The student editors of English, Hindi, Punjabi, Commerce, Computer Science and Science sections of the college magazine are selected on the basis of written tests.

Punjabi Virsa Kender

The *Punjabi Virsa Kender* is the modest effort to preserve and thus connect the youth of Punjab to its roots. In two halls on the second floor of the



library, there is a veritable collection of artifacts, tools and implements that at once transports the spectator to the rich heritage of Punjab. The students along with faculty are encouraged to visit villages for collection of articles that reflect erstwhile Punjab.





Laboratories

The college maintains a good number of adequate Laboratories in Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Computer Science & IT departments. Every year, a good amount is spent in



upkeeping and modernizing the Laboratories, Museum, Botanical Garden; Physics Workshop and a Study Centre. Better research microscopes, projectors, microtomes, overhead projectors, oven, incubators, camera lucida have been added, making teaching of science much more sophisticated and quality oriented.

Botanical Garden

The college is proud to have one of the oldest, well maintained Botanical Garden in the entire region. Apart from providing a green feast to the beholders, it is utilized by the students of Botany department for practical



research projects and assignments mentioned in syllabus.

Women Cell

Women's Cell of the college is a platform for redressal of grievances of girl students & lady staff members. Besides it creates awareness among students & staff regarding gender equality through guest



lectures, seminars, discussions, plays and other academic & cocurricular activities. Dr. Rajni Bala is the Convener of the Cell.

On Campus Bank Facility

The State Bank of India has its branch in the college campus. Complete banking service including ATM facility is available to students and staff for sake of their convenience.



College Canteen

The college canteen & café offer beverages, coffee, tea snacks, sweets & other eatables at reasonable rates. There is a committee of staff and students which inspects the canteen



periodically for the maintenance of proper cleanliness, discipline and quality of food served.

AC Conference Hall

The college has a Seminar / Conference hall which is fully air conditioned and well furnished. It can accommodate at least 125 participants. It is well equipped with multimedia projector to hold seminars, conferences & symposia.



Open Air Theatre

The college has a unique open air theatre located in green surroundings with seating capacity of more than 600. It is constantly used for cultural programmes,



theatrical pageants & performances, stage rehearsals, mass awareness programmes and other co-academic functions.

Gymnasium

In order to maintain good health and make preparation for national and international sports & athletic competitions, the students can avail the facility of a well-equipped gymnasium inside the college. The



Department of Physical Education takes keen initiatives to upkeep and maintain the gym equipments. Its overall incharge is Ms. Parminderjeet Kaur.

First-Aid Centre

The college has established a First-Aid Centre and health unit on college campus to provide immediate medical care to students and staff. A trained nurse is available to provide first aid, medicines and medical help.



Baring Alumni Association

Baring Alumni Association has been formed with an aim to provide a platform to former students of our college where they not only revive their past memories but also put forward



their suggestion for the betterment of present generation of students. This association holds annual 'get-togethers' and honors Baring alumni who have made college proud. Many of the former Baring students continue to extend financial support to the alumni association. Presently Ms. Savita is Convener of the Baring Alumni Association.

Legal Literacy Cell

The Legal Literacy Cell (LLC), established in 2012-13 has organised various activities to create legal awareness among youth. The students of the cell participate in different events, organised by Legal Literacy Department



of Punjab Government. Dr. Ritu Pandhi Nayyar is its new Convener.



Guidance, Counselling & Placement Cell

Students are quite often not clear about career options and opportunities. They need mature guidance for sorting out their confusions and dilemmas. To advise them in this matter, a cell has been set up in the college under the



dynamic leadership of senior members of the staff. The Cell arranges guest lectures by experts and specialists from different fields. It also acts as a mediator between the job market and the students. Dr. Ritu Phandhi Nayyar is its Convener.


